Indemnification: I shall indemnify and defend The City of South Fulton, Fulton County Public Safety Training Center, and the South Fulton Fire Rescue Department employees against all claims, causes of action, damages, judgments, costs, or expenses, including litigation costs and attorney(s) fees, which may arise because of my child's participation in the Junior Firefighter Program. Such indemnification shall not be limited toactual damages but may include other specific damages.

Choice of Law: I agree that my child settle all disputes with the South Fulton Fire Department and any parties acting on their behalf in Georgia and using Georgia law.

- c Full Agreement: Lagree that neither Lnor my child nor anyone from the City of South Fulton nor the South Fulton Fire Rescue Department has made any promises or agreements that do not appear within the body of this document.
- d Terms: I and my child agree to the following conditions for participation in the Girls
- 1. My child shall not serve in any primary firefighting role but shall at all times serve as a support volunteer who is present only under the supervision of qualified firefighters, either volunteer or paid.
- 2 My child shall follow all rules, orders; and other instructions given by the supervising members of the sponsoring Fire Department.
- 3 Failure to follow all rules, orders, and other instructions given by the supervising members of the sponsoring Fire Department may result in dismissal from the Program. Such dismissal is at the discretion of the supervising members of the camp and shall not be an appealable

4 My child shall adhere to a code of conduct that is courteous, respectful, civil, and professional at all times while participating in the Girls Firefighter Camp.

I further understand that my child is not a firefighter under state law and does not qualify in any manner for benefits or other programs open to those firefighters qualified as professional or volunteer firefighters. Neither I nor my child shall make any claim to those benefits or programsavailable to paid or volunteer

2022 CAMP E.M.B.E.R.S.

Rules and Regulations

No camper may leave camp without permission of Incident Commander/Camp Director. If you leave, written permission from your parent of guardian is required. The only exception is for a medical emergency, and you must be accompanied by one (1) member of staff.

- There is a zero-tolerance policy for all participants regarding drugs, alcohol, violence, and violations of the law.
 Any participant who violates this zero-tolerance policy shall be dismissed from the camp; and
- 2 All medications must be checked in with the camp's Safety/Medical Officer at registration.
- Campers are expected to adhere to the dress code further explained in camper's list included Attachment #6.
- 4 All campers will be at their assigned locations. Schedules will always be posted and available. Personnel accountability is essential to the safety of all campers.
- 5. Campers who bring a car to camp must leave the vehicle parked during camp and the keys given to the Incident Commander/Camp Director.
- 6 Campers are not permitted in others' belongings. Stealing will not be tolerated. Violators will be sent home and proper authorities notified.
- 7. Campers will be responsible for the cost of any damages to facilities outside intended use for camp.
- 8 Campers are expected to treat fellow campers, camp staff and any visitors or dignitaries with respect, and kindness. A camper being disrespectful, rude, or acting in an inappropriate manner will not be tolerated. Failure to correct disruptive and inappropriate behavior will result in their dismissal from camp.
- 9. All cell phones brought to the camp shall be checked in with the Camp Director. Students will be allotted a time each day to check messages and make phone calls. Due to the nature of the camp, phones will become misplaced and/or damaged; therefore, phones will be allowed only in the classroom. There are "NO" exceptions. Failure to obey rules will result in loss of privileges. If there may be an emergency requiring immediate contact, please call Lt. Tangela Rowe at 470-825-1949.
- 10 Campers shall follow all health and safety regulations and procedures, including the use of personal protective equipment (PPE) as required.
- 11. If you become ill or injured, immediately notify a camp staff member.
- 12 The City of South Fulton, South Fulton Fire Rescue Department, nor the Fulton County Public Safety Training Center are not responsible for loss, theft, or damage of personal items brought to camp.
- 13. Campers are to be picked up from camp promptly by 4:30 pm with no exceptions!


